Control descriptions will be printed on the map only. On the Green and Blue courses these cover the legend.

Terrain: A mixture of fast open grassland and runnable forest on a North facing slope.

Orange course is on the open area only.

Start: Approx. 600m from registration along a private track, please take care as there

may be the occasional vehicle. The start and finish are close together and there will be a clothing dump, please bring your own bag. It will be a punching start.

Clothing: Full body cover must be worn. Whistles should be carried. As the open areas are

very exposed in adverse weather we will ask you to wear a cagoule or similar

waterproof top.

Bio- Please come to the event with clean and dry shoes and clothing. After your run security: please follow the guidance that helps protect our precious environment:

- Check
- Clean
- Dry

Before leaving the event **check** your clothing and equipment and remove any mud, soil or leaf litter.

Once home thoroughly **clean** your footwear and clothing and then leave it to **dry** for as long as possible. Many invasive non-native species are able to survive in damp corners for very long periods of time, but are less able to survive if the equipment is thoroughly dried.

Hazards:

Please be aware of the risk of ticks and Lymes disease. The area is frequented by ponies, deer and livestock and the usual precautions to avoid infection apply.

This is a popular area for walkers, cyclists and horse riders please be considerate.

Safety: The safety bearing is South, follow the fence back to the underpass which is

very close to the start. Courses close at 14:00 hrs.

Competitors attending the event alone MUST leave their car key at

Registration.

All competitors must report to Download before 2.15pm even if retiring from

the event.
